The General Data Protection Regulation (the “GDPR”) came into effect on 25 May 2018. The GDPR will be directly effective in each EU member state, with the aim that the same rules will be applied uniformly within the EU. This marks a shift in the approach to data protection at a European level, which until 25 May 2018 relied on national implementing of legislation in each EU member state.
